

ABC Amateur Race Club Scrap Heap Sculpture Competition

Prize: \$1000

Closing Date: 9 June 2010

ABC Amateur Race Club is conducting a Scrap Heap (recycled metals) Sculpture Competition. The winning entry will be erected at the Club grounds to commemorate the Club's 100th anniversary.

Competition is open to individuals and collaborations.

Artwork:

Sculpture submitted should be no larger than 2.6m³ and no smaller than 1.6m³. It must be free standing and mounted on 300mmx300mmx3mm plate steel.

Sculpture should be produced from recycled metal and/or metal components and must be suitable for long term outdoors exhibition.

Inspiration for the Sculpture should come from the following phrase:

“100 years
of bush racing
heritage”

Rules

The ABC Amateur Race Club (“AARC”) is conducting a recycled metal Sculpture Competition. The prize of \$1000.00 is an award to an artist (or collaboration) to design and produce a sculpture from recycled metal components (“the sculpture”) for possible display at the AARC grounds.

The prize will be awarded to the sculpture that most successfully reflects the theme of the competition, within these rules established for the competition.

The winning sculpture must be capable of being erected in an outdoors location subject to a wide range of weather elements. The sculpture may also be used in any other AARC activities in which the AARC is involved.

The competition is open to all persons.

A judging panel chosen by the AARC will nominate a winner and the judges reserve the right not to select a winner. The decision of the judges is final and no correspondence shall be entered into.

Conditions of Entry:

1. The size of the work must be no less than 1.6m³ and no more than 2.6m³
2. The work must be freestanding, mounted on 300mmx300mmx3mm plate steel.
3. Entries must be submitted fixed securely to a pallet. They will be judged while in this state, so should be mounted appropriately.
4. Entries must be delivered to the AARC at its grounds on Brunette Downs Station, Tablelands Highway, via Tennant Creek, NT between the 9th - 18th June 2010.
5. Each competitor may enter up to 2 designs.
6. The entry must be the original work of the competitors.
7. Entries must be pre registered by the 9th June 2010 by submitting the Entry Form by fax, post or email.
8. One entry form is required for each work submitted.
9. Entries must be clearly labelled with a plastic tag with the artists name, address and the title of their work.
10. Entrants agree that, by submitting their sculptures give an

irrevocable (but non exclusive) license and permission to the AARC to use their submitted sculpture(s) in connection with any activities of the AARC. The AARC will in using any sculptures give due and reasonable attribution to the artists. Use of the sculptures for the purposes of AARC activities includes, but is not limited to: any exhibition, publication, transfer to any media, sub licensing, any dealing with whole or part of the sculpture, reworking of the sculpture for any AARC use. All submitting artists agree that they will make available to the AARC upon request their artwork(s) for the use of the AARC.

11. Sculptures should be 3 dimensional and constructed from recycled metal components. They must be suitable to be displayed outside, unprotected from the elements. The AARC reserves the right to exclude any artwork which in its opinion is not capable of long term exterior display.
12. The AARC will not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever, and however caused, to any artwork while in its custody. Any insurance of artworks is the responsibility of the submitting artist. The AARC will not be liable in connection with artwork, its content, subject matter, or exhibition or publication. All such liability remains with the artist(s).
13. The AARC reserves the rights to exclude any sculpture which in its opinion does not comply with these rules or which in content or subject matter is contrary to the mission or work of the AARC. The winning artist agrees to make themselves available for the purposes of promotion and publicity at times and dates in places reasonably requested by the AARC.
